

Herbert Weber

Herbert Weber was born in Old Coventry, Conn on Jan 14, 1919. He died on Thursday 9 August 2001, following a brief illness, and is survived by his wife, Margot Orloff Weber, two daughters, a grandson, two nephews, and a grandniece and grandnephew.

Herbert joined the Army Air Corps and served in England in WW2, flying P-47 Thunderbolts in the 356th Fighter Group out of Martlesham Aerodrome. He later flew F-86 Sabre jets in air-to-air combat with MiG-15s in Korea, and served as a Major in the Air Force in Strategic Air Command until his retirement in 1966.

During his retirement, he continued flying until he was 79. Herbert was instrumental in organizing the Martlesham Heath Aviation Society, and the Control Tower Museum
